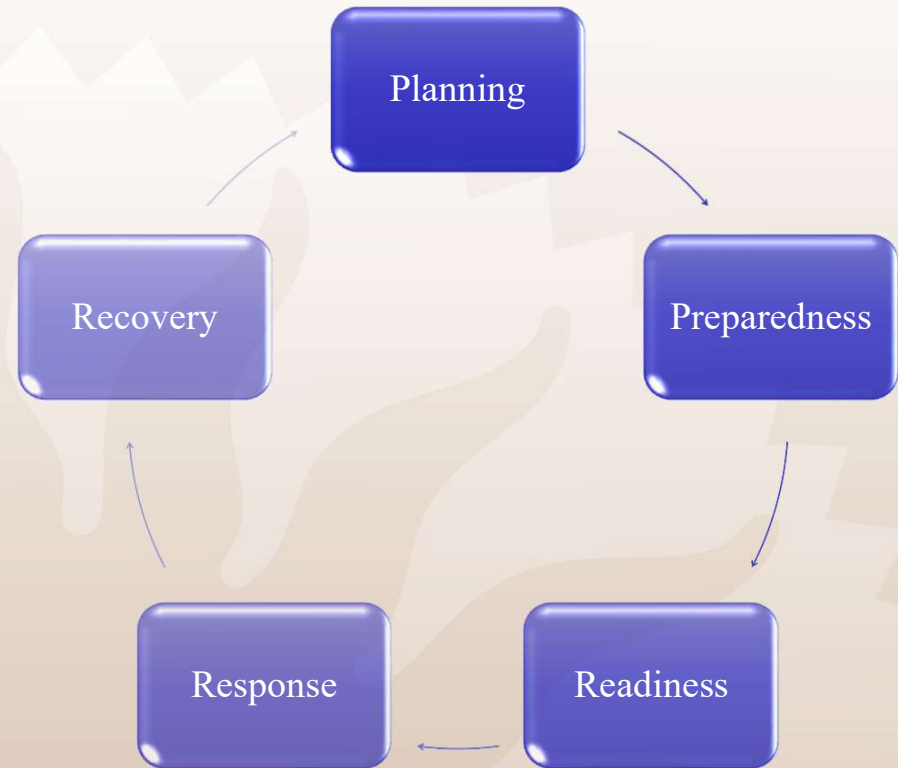
# Planning for Our Community

- **Goals**
  - Address the needs of the most vulnerable members of our community
  - View with a Racial Equity lens through all aspects of disaster planning and preparedness
- **Current Objectives**
  - Shelter Management Plan
  - C-POD Project

# Shelter Management Plan

Planning, Preparedness, Readiness, Response, Recovery

- Dynamic, flexible and scalable to be applicable to incidents ranging from small-scale emergencies to a major catastrophe affecting the City



# Shelter Management Plan

- Identify needs of at-risk populations which include non-English or limited-English speaking residents, children, seniors, and those with socioeconomic barriers and Access and Functional Needs
- Include plans and procedures for accommodating animals during all phases of an emergency

# Shelter Management Plan

- Collaboration with City departments, stakeholders and community partners including:
  - PRNS and ARC for Shelter preparedness, readiness and management
  - Collaborate with CADRE to ensure an AFN coordinator is part of our process in addressing the needs of the AFN community

# C-POD Project

- 2020-2022 Regional Catastrophic Preparedness Grant Program (RCPGP)
- Bay Area Urban Areas Security Initiative (BAUASI) collaboration

# C-POD Project

- Assist member jurisdictions in research for C-POD site selection
  - Conduct background research
  - Develop additional C-POD site plans
  - Provide template material to help establish MOUs
  - Coordinate with other agencies for resource allocation

# C-POD Project

- Estimated that 128,000 San Jose Residents may need C-POD support in a disaster
  - Assess communities that will have the greatest need in a disaster affecting the entire City of San Jose
  - Assess potential sites for feasibility of accommodating a vehicle or pedestrian C-POD

# C-POD Project

- Consider transportation routes and access for supply vehicles
- Research density of grocers and community-based food resources
- Assess availability of Disaster Service Workers for staffing

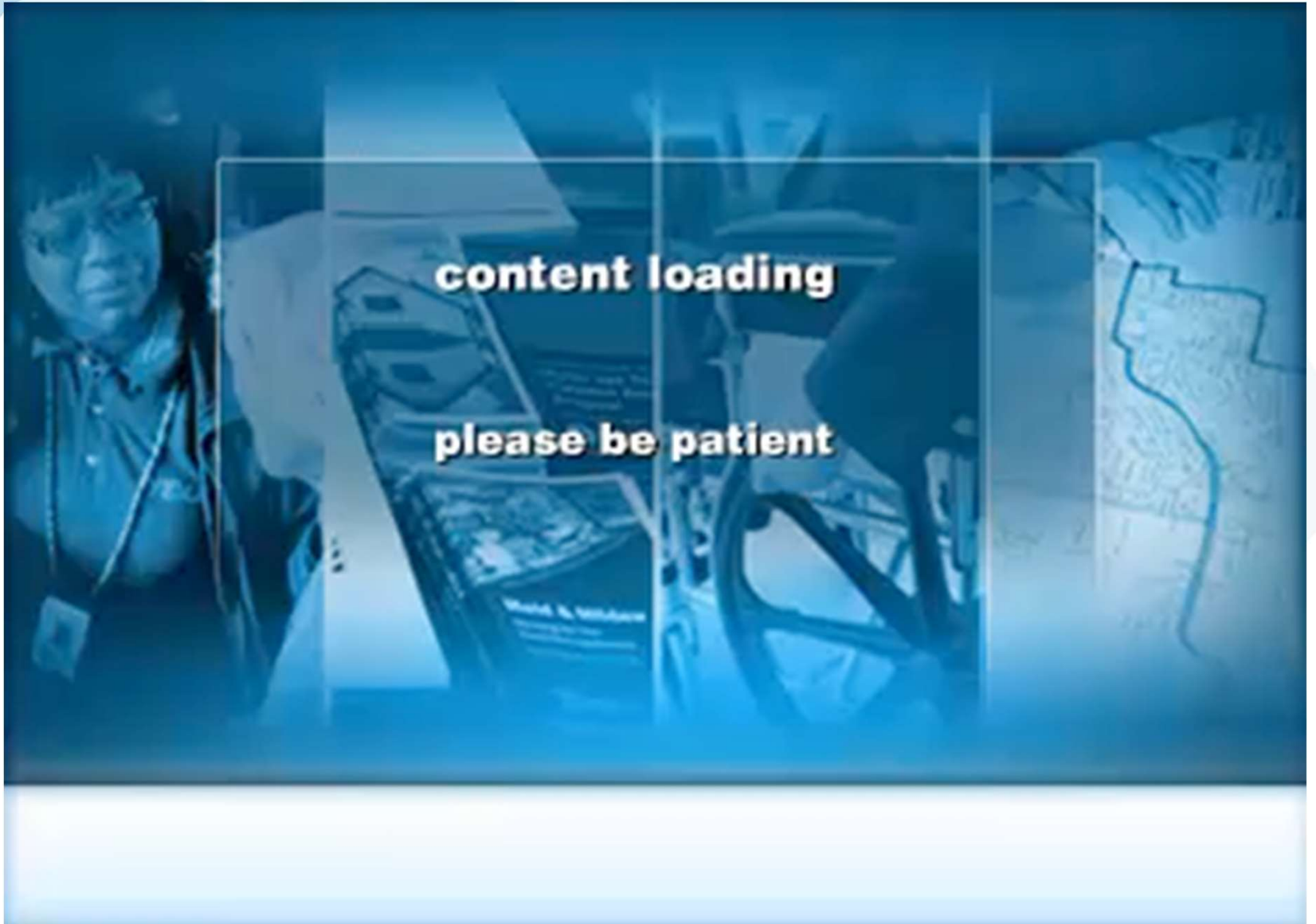
