- Slide 4. County and City Emergency Notification Systems
 - Sign up for <u>AlertSCC</u> AlertSCC is used everywhere in the County. You
 MUST sign up to receive alerts and you can choose to receive them on your
 smartphone by voice or text, landline phone or by email. The site is
 translated into Spanish, Chinese, and Vietnamese.
 - Some cities and police and fire agencies use another notification system called Nixle. To sign up for Nixle, text your zip code to 888777. You can log in to http://www.nixle.com/, to select the types of alerts you want to receive, like police activity, missing people, street closures, and local events.
 - W.E.A. or Wireless Emergency Alerts does not require registration, but you
 have to make sure that the Emergency Notifications setting on your
 smartphone is turned on.

Turning on the Emergency Notifications Setting on Your Smartphone Android

- On your Android device, open Settings.
- Tap Notifications. Wireless emergency alerts.
- Select the alerts you want to receive.

iPhone

- Open your Settings app.
- Tap Notifications. Go into the notifications section of your settings
- Scroll to the bottom of the screen. You'll see a section marked Government Alerts.
- Choose the option you want to edit the settings for and turn it on or off, as desired.
- Slide 5. MyShake App <u>Apple App Store</u> and <u>Google Play for Android</u> **MyShake app** gives you a few seconds notice that a 4.5 magnitude or higher earthquake is about to occur. For more information click here
