# PREPARE CHILDREN FOR EMERGENCIES

Involve your children in preparing for emergencies and take extra steps in protecting your family, this will increase your children's confidence and help give them a sense of control.

## STEP#

#### HAVE A FAMILY DISCUSSION ABOUT EMERGENCIES



It's important to warn children, without overly alarming them, about emergencies. Tell children that emergencies can hurt people or cause damage, discuss some of the things that could happen if an emergency occurs (ex. Power going out), and let them know that there are things we can do to stay safe and that many people are here to help (firefighters, police, paramedics, etc.).

# STEP# 7

#### TEACH CHILDREN EMERGENCY SKILLS. MAKE SURE THEY KNOW:



- Their full name, parents names, phone numbers, and home address, including landmarks and cross streets,
- ✓ How and when to call 911 (and that it is not a joke to dial it),
- ✓ How to be alert of and respond to emergnecies, and
- ✓ How to stay safe from strangers. Let them know to trust their instincts and not to trust someone just because they know their name; Consider creating a family password/phrase to prevent children from going with a stranger.

## STEP# 3

#### MAKE AN EMERGENCY PLAN & KIT TOGETHER & PRACTICE YOUR PLAN REGULARLY



- Have children make their own, small emergency kit that includes comfort items and entertainment (stuffed animals, toys, board games, etc.).
- Practice your plan and update your kit at least twice a year; try to make it fun: hold a scavenger hunt, looking for items that can go in your kit, have emergency trivia, give small rewards, or consider simulating post-emergency conditions by going without electricity or tap water for a few hours.
- ✓ **Talk to your children's school to learn their plans and share yours.** In California, schools are required to have a disaster plan, to hold periodic drop, cover and hold drills and to hold educational and training programs for students and staff.




