



What do VALs do?

VALs bring knowledge and experience

- ➤ Assist in determining best strategies for building capacity in the community
- ➤ Assist in coordinating resources to more effectively assist the community in times of need
- ➤ Help establish a coalition with existing Community Based Organizations (CBOs)
- ➤ Offer training on how delivery of services can be more effective to communities affected by disaster.

VAL in Response and Recovery

- ➤ Assist in the development of Community Groups and long-term recovery
 - ➢ Share Best Practices No need to recreate things
- > Solicit engagement from all sectors of the community
- Find those who can provide Money, Muscle, & Material
- Assist in the coordination of sheltering, debris removal, home repair, rebuilding, and addressing individuals' unmet needs

VAL in Preparedness and Mitigation

Support the community and voluntary agencies in:

- Community education about preparedness techniques and mitigation measures
- Participating in planning, training, and exercises
- Engaging the whole community in determining vulnerabilities and resources

The VAL's Role in Meetings and with Voluntary Organizations

- > "Lead From Behind"
- ➤ Provide vital statistics/updates
- ➤ Effective Partnership Communication
- > Share Best Practices and proven methods
- > Get community to work effectively together

 - ➤ Get everyone involved to communicate, collaborate, cooperate, and coordinate

Individual Assistance

- The Recovery Individual Assistance (IA) Unit coordinates with federal, state, local, and voluntary entities to provide recovery assistance to individuals, households, businesses, and agricultural communities affected by an emergency or disaster.
 - Pre-disaster coordination, guidance, and training
 - Disaster Assistance Program Coordination
 - Local Assistance Centers
 - Inquiries
 - Preliminary Damage Assessments
 - Voluntary Agency Liaison (VAL) support





Voluntary Agency Liaison (VAL)

- The primary purpose of the Voluntary Agency Liaison (VAL) is to foster a strong rapport among voluntary and faith-based organizations, and local communities.
- VALs work with Long Term Recovery Groups (LTRGs) and Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (VOADs) in all phases of disaster to communicate, coordinate, cooperate, and collaborate.
- A VAL supports local efforts to provide effective and timely relief services to those who have begun their recovery from emergency or disaster.





Goals

- Serve as a critical link between the community and government, VALs and voluntary agencies work to provide quick and efficient disaster relief for survivors.
- VALs support ongoing efforts to meet any unmet needs survivors have during and after a disaster.





Voluntary Agency Liaison (VAL)

VALs work during all phases of an emergency:

- Preparedness
- Response
- Recovery









Role During Preparedness

Builds relationships with Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (VOADs)/Community
Organizations Active in Disaster (COAD), faith and community-based organizations, and
government agencies

- Shares information on resources organizations may provide
- Supports development and sustainability of local VOAD/COAD partners
- Supports NorCal, SoCal and National VOAD initiatives
- Provides input for community and government response plans
- Participates in VOAD partner discussions to support long term recovery efforts
- Promotes individual and organizational preparedness





Role During Response

- Communication link among emergency management and VOAD member organizations
- Meets to share information and coordinate activities
- Coordinates disaster response of member organizations
 - Mass Care sheltering, feeding, pet care, emotional and spiritual counseling
 - Volunteer Management
 - Donations Management
- Provide point of contact for response efforts
- Support the state Local Assistance Centers and FEMA Disaster Recovery Centers





Role During Recovery

- Assist with Long Term Recovery Group (LTRG) Formation
 - Shares best practices and provide trainings
 - Brings additional philanthropic resources when needed
 - Brings VOAD and Faith and Community-Based Organizations to the table (money, muscle, materials)
 - Support rebuilds and/or repair projects
- Long Term Assistance
 - Works closely with member agencies and local Emergency Management, to develop long term recovery strategies and resources
 - Assists by coordinating, collaborating, communicating and cooperation with the LTRG and community
 - Connect LTRGs with other LTRGs in CA to share information, expertise/best practices and resources
- Advocates for communities and voluntary groups
